1. MEDICAL:

Wellbeing is fundamental to our health and overall happiness. Our Medical team consists of specialists in various medical fields who can provide guidance and resources in all health related matters. To further APS' objectives, our Physicians will provide free services to the needy.

2. LEGAL:

Legal guidance is central in providing access to justice by ensuring equality before the law. Our Legal team will consist of attorneys who specialize in different practice area, who can guide our community members and provide free of cost services to members who cannot afford the attorney fees.

3. FINAL RITES:

Last rites are an integral part of our funeral traditions. When there is a death in the family, relatives face not only emotional grief but also many issues coordinating Final Rites services for their lost loved one. Our team will help the grieving family in all possible ways to ensure raditions are adhered to and members can grieve their family member.

4. MATRIMONIAL:

The goal of marriage is to create a blissful union between a couple and foster love for the entire family, which keeps the family happily united. Our team will organize Meet and Greet events for our youth on a regular basis to create an environment for our singles to interact with like minded and similar background individuals.

5. YOUTH WING:

Sports are a crucial part of a youth's growth and development. We will encourage our youth to participate in Sports like Kabaddi and Cricket. APS will organize tournaments to encourage interplay between our youth.

6. CREATE AWARENESS ABOUT PUNJABI CULTURE AND PEOPLE:

While Punjabis are known for our strong values, our culture presents a multi-hued heritage of ancient civilizations. We will arrange seminars, lectures, public meetings to educate the mainstream Americans about Punjabi Arts, Culture, and the most crucial aspect of being a Punjabi, our faith and religion which emphasizes (1) Service to the community; (2) Equality and Respect amongst all humans; (3) Peaceful Living; and (4) Seva - defined as “selfless service” without any personal gain.

7. FUTURE PLANS:

By offering social, educational, and wellness programs, Community Centers contribute to enhancing the quality of life for community residents. Our future plan is to build a Community Center with a main hall and several smaller halls where community functions can take place. The Halls can be used for weddings, social events like Diwali and Vaisakhi. Smaller Halls can be used by our members, elders to do get-togethers. We will have a Library as well.

Please accept my warmest congratulations once again. I wish you and all APS members a joyous Gala evening and continued success in your noble mission.




Guest of Honor: Neeru Bajwa Global Icon of Punjabi Cinema

GURU TEGH BAHADUR JI

A Legacy of Courage, Faith, and Sacrifice



Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji: A Legacy of Courage, Faith, and Sacrifice

Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, the ninth Guru of the Sikhs, stands as a towering figure in Sikh history, remembered not only for his spiritual wisdom but also for his courage, compassion, and unwavering commitment to justice. Born as Tyag Mal on April 1, 1621, in Amritsar, he was the youngest son of Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji, the sixth Sikh Guru. From his early years, he showed a deep spiritual inclination, as he embraced meditation, devotion, and service to humanity. His life was guided by Sikh principles of righteousness, humility, and selfless service, which later defined his role as a Guru and moral leader.


Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji's teachings emphasized the importance of inner spiritual growth, moral integrity, and devotion to God. He encouraged his followers to live honest and ethical lives, to treat all human beings with respect, and to defend righteousness. Unlike many religious leaders

of his time, Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji believed that spiritual strength should be paired with action in the face of injustice. Witnessing the suffering of the people and the threat to freedom of faith, Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji took a stand. In 1675, Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji sacrificed himself for humanity. Even though he was tortured and pressured to give up his beliefs, he stayed true to his principles. His life teaches that spiritual devotion is inseparable

from the duty to fight injustice and protect the vulnerable. The 350th anniversary of his martyrdom serves as a reminder of these values.



Every year, Sikhs and admirers of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji commemorate his life and sacrifice through prayers, kirtan (devotional singing), and community service. Gurdwaras (Sikh temples) organize special programs to honor his teachings, highlighting his message of courage, compassion, and spiritual strength. Through these observances, his legacy continues to inspire individuals to live with integrity, uphold justice, and act selflessly for the welfare of humanity.

Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji's life and sacrifice remind us that freedom, justice, and faith are values worth defending, no matter the cost. He embodied the highest ideals of courage and moral conviction, and his martyrdom serves as a pillar of hope for all those who face oppression. As we commemorate his 350th martyrdom, we honor not only a spiritual leader but also a hero whose life continues to guide humanity toward truth, righteousness, and compassion.

His teachings remain deeply relevant in a world where freedom of belief and

human rights are still under threat. By reflecting on his life, we are reminded that one person's courage can inspire generations, challenge injustice, and create lasting change. IRON DEFICIENCY ANEMIA (IDA)

Simply Complex

This is one of the most common problems in physicians' offices. Almost everyone in the audience today has heard about iron deficiency in their family members or amongst their friend circles. In some studies, the prevalence of iron deficiency has been anywhere from 38% to 77% depending on how they defined iron deficiency, more common in women than men. However, how to manage these simple blood problems is not as simple as we think. There are several myths and a lot of misinformation that makes these simple issues somewhat complex. Both patients and physicians can have their own biases based on hearsay and somewhat murkier literature on Dr. Google (no one knows which medical school Dr. Google went to, and no one questions about the credentials). There are some differences in how blood specialists such as me approach it than other physicians. That also creates confusion amongst patients. I see this entity of deficiency anemia in my office a lot – both in cancer patients as well as those without any cancer. I thought of sharing some pearls with you all so that there can be some clarity.



IDA in Women: Needs special mention because it is very common and affects functioning on a daily basis.
Much more common than men. Iron deficiency is very common in young girls and women because a different physiological needs as they lose blood monthly. It is much more common in women than men because of above reasons. Some of them are unfortunate enough to have heavy periods for prolonged periods of time and need/require repeated iron infusions.

SYMPTOMS OF IDA:

Some of these are:

- Fatigue/tiredness
- Lack of concentration
- Lightheadedness/dizziness
- Shortness of breath
- Heart Palpitations
- Increased sleepiness
- Hair loss
- Craving for some foods such as sand, paper, cardboard, ice, soap, hair, thread, chalk
- Family members notice pallor or light yellowness of the skin
- Restless legs



DIAGNOSIS:

Made with simple blood tests – ranges in the results may be slightly different in different labs.:

LOW HEMOGLOBIN

Low Ferritin – is diagnostic – levels may be differently interpreted by blood specialists as compared with other physicians especially in conditions with chronic inflammation, kidney disease.

In some cases, special tests such as iron binding capacity, reticulocyte hemoglobin, soluble transferrin receptor status are helpful especially when ferritin cannot be relied upon and is falsely normal (can be so in inflammatory conditions)

Iron levels alone are not usually helpful as this level changes with the intake that day

While bone marrow aspiration and biopsy are the ultimate diagnostic tests but it is not recommended/needed in vast majority of cases

Iron rich foods are recommended in a lot more quantity in iron deficient patients than non-anemic patients

Animal Sources:

- Lean red meat (beef, lamb, pork) - usually discouraged because of other issues
- Poultry (chicken, turkey)
- Seafood (oysters, clams, mussels)
- Eggs

Plant Sources:

absorption helped by Vit C containing foods

- Legumes (beans, lentils, peas)
- Dark leafy green vegetables (spinach, kale, collard greens, beets)
- Fortified cereals and breads
- Nuts and seeds (cashews, almonds, pumpkin seeds)
- Dried fruits (raisins, prunes, apricots)

Iron replacement – Oral iron vs intravenous iron:

IV is preferred for a quick response and to decrease blood transfusion and provides high levels of storage iron which can continue to be used for weeks to months after just one set of infusions (usually range from 2-5 doses) - **not recommended/no data during first trimester of pregnancy.**

There is a big difference in these recommendations between blood specialists and other physicians.

IV iron preparations available currently are extremely safe, and the side effects are quite uncommon to rare.

Oral iron can be given 3 times a week or daily. Once a day iron is the most recommended these days. Taking iron 3 times, a day may be counter-productive and less efficacious. More than once a day does not help as per the studies – **must be continued for at least several months for the same effects as with 1 set of IV dose**

Extremely Important: To find the cause of IDA.

In all adults (all men and those women who do not have menstrual blood loss) - full diagnostic Gastro-intestinal (GI) work-up is recommended.

It includes upper endoscopy as well as a colonoscopy regardless of age, ideally.

If both unable to determine the cause, a capsule study is recommended.

At an old age above 85, ideally it should be done but practically, we can take it on a case-by-case basis after looking at the risks of the invasive.

procedure vs the benefits. I have sent a 96-year-old patient for a diagnostic colonoscopy.

It is not a screening test at a time of IDA but diagnostic, and there is supposed to be no age limit.

Iron deficiency but normal hgb:

There are some patients who have low ferritin and symptoms of anemia but normal hgb. Dehydration should be considered and ruled out in these cases and adequate fluid + electrolyte intake is recommended. However, replacement of iron is recommended to bring up ferritin ~ 100 especially in those where the symptom is restless legs. Oral iron is preferred in this situation. However, most of the patients have difficulty taking or absorbing iron and, in these cases, fewer doses of IV iron are recommended than in frankly iron deficient patients.

Day 1 - Gurdwara Bebe Nanki Saheb



Gurdwara Bebe Nanaki Saheb – Dera Chahal, Lahore, Pakistan

Gurdwara Bebe Nanaki Saheb, located in **Dera Chahal near Lahore, Pakistan**, is a sacred shrine dedicated to **Bebe Nanaki Ji**, the beloved elder sister and first disciple of *Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji*. Regarded as the first to recognize Guru Nanak's divine light, Bebe Nanaki Ji holds a unique and honored place in Sikh history.

The gurdwara, situated about **35 km from Lahore**, stands in a peaceful rural setting and commemorates the period when Bebe Nanaki Ji lived in this region. Though modest in structure, the shrine carries deep spiritual significance, reflecting her unwavering faith, compassion, and the pivotal role she played in nurturing Guru Nanak's early life and mission. Today, visiting jathas often perform **kirtan**, **ardaa**s, and **langar** here, bringing life and devotion to this historic site. Gurdwara Bebe Nanaki Sahib remains a symbol of pure love, spiritual insight, and the profound contribution of Bebe Nanaki Ji—the first Sikh and the first to understand Guru Nanak's divine purpose.

Day 2 –Gurdwara Shri Shahid Ganj Singh Singania



Gurdwara Shahid Ganj Singh Singania, also known as **Gurdwara Shaheedganj Singh Singania**, is a historic Sikh shrine located in the Naulakha Bazaar area of Lahore, Pakistan. This sacred site marks the place where, during the 18th century, tens of thousands of Sikh men and women were martyred for their unwavering faith and resistance against persecution. The gurdwara stands as a solemn tribute to their courage, sacrifice, and steadfast commitment to Sikh principles. Directly opposite the shrine is Gurdwara Bhai Taru Singh Ji, further anchoring this neighborhood as one of the most significant centers of Sikh martyrdom and remembrance in the region's history.

Day 2 – Visit to Gurdwara Janam Asthan Shri Guru Ram Dass Ji



Gurdwara Janam Asthan Shri Guru Ram Dass Ji – Lahore, Pakistan
Gurdwara Janam Asthan Shri Guru Ram Dass Ji, located in **Chuna Mandi** within the historic walled city of **Lahore**, marks the sacred birthplace of **Shri Guru Ram Dass Ji**, the fourth Sikh Guru and the visionary founder of Shri Amritsar. This modest yet deeply revered shrine stands as a tribute to the Guru Ji's early life, his humility, devotion, and the message of seva that shaped Sikh tradition. Visitors experience a profound sense of connection to Sikh heritage, as the site continues to symbolize the spiritual foundations upon which Shri Amritsar and the Golden Temple were built.

Day 3 and 4 – Lahore Sightseeing



Along with visiting the historic gurdwaras, the APS team enjoyed wonderful sightseeing, delicious local cuisine, and memorable musical evenings that made the journey even more special.

Day 5 – Lahore Sightseeing Fort Maharaja Ranjit Singh



Maharaja Ranjit Singh Fort, commonly known as **Lahore Fort**, is a historic landmark located in the city of Sheikhupura in Punjab, Pakistan. Originally built during the Mughal era and later renovated and expanded under Maharaja Ranjit Singh—who ruled the Sikh Empire from **1801 to 1839**—the fort served as an important military stronghold and royal residence during his reign. Its towering walls, grand gateways, and intricately designed chambers reflect both the architectural strength and refined aesthetics of the period. The fort played a key strategic role in securing the region and stands today as a powerful reminder of Maharaja Ranjit Singh's leadership, vision, and the rich heritage of the Sikh Empire.

Day 6 - Gurdwara Janam Asthan Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji

Nankana Sahib, Pakistan



Gurdwara Janam Asthan, located in **Nankana Sahib, Punjab, Pakistan**, marks the sacred birthplace of **Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji**, the founder of Sikhism. One of the most revered Sikh pilgrimage sites, the gurdwara stands on the spot where Shri Guru Nanak Dev ji was born in 1469 and beautifully represents his message of oneness, compassion, and truthful living.

The majestic white-marble complex, expansive courtyards, and serene Sarovar create an atmosphere of deep spiritual peace. Formerly known as Rai Bhoi Di Talwandi, the town was renamed Nankana Sahib in honor of Shri Guru Nanak Dev ji, and the shrine remains a central destination for Sikh pilgrims from around the world.

Day 6 - Gurdwara Shri Tambu Saheb

GURDWARA TAMBU SAHIB
NANKANA SAHIB PAKISTAN

Gurdwara Shri Tambu Saheb is a site associated with the short stories of Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, particularly his childhood. One key story recounts him hiding under a tree canopy (tambu) to escape his father's anger after a "true bargain" (Sacha Sauda) and another describes how the tree's shade remained stationary over him while others shifted, demonstrating a miraculous presence.

Day 6 - Gurdwara Shri Mal Ji Saheb

The Divine Miracle of the Serpent's Shade



Gurdwara Shri Mal Ji Sahib marks the sacred site where a divine miracle from Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji's childhood took place. While young Shri Guru Nanak Dev ji rested in the fields on a hot day, a large cobra rose beside him and spread its hood to shield him from the harsh sun. As the sun moved, the serpent adjusted its position, keeping Shri Guru Nanak Dev ji completely shaded.

Amazed by this sight, Rai Bular—the local overseer—recognized the divine radiance of the young Guru and declared that he was no ordinary child. This blessed moment is preserved today at Gurdwara Shri Mal Ji Sahib in Nankana Sahib, honoring the early signs of Shri Guru Nanak Dev Ji's spiritual greatness.

Day 6 - Gurdwara Shri Kiara Saheb

Nankana Sahib, Pakistan



Gurdwara Shri Kiara Sahib, located in Nankana Sahib, Pakistan, commemorates a beautiful early miracle from the childhood of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. The word *Kiara* means “field,” and it is here that young Guru Nanak was grazing his family’s cattle when they wandered into a farmer’s cultivated crops. The distressed farmer complained that his entire field had been ruined. However, when the farmer and Mehta Kalu Ji rushed to inspect the damage, they were astonished to find the crops standing perfectly untouched—fresh, upright, and unharmed, as though no cattle had ever passed through. This gentle miracle revealed the divine protection surrounding Guru Nanak even as a child and showed that no harm could arise from his presence. Today, Gurdwara Kiara Sahib stands as a peaceful reminder of the Guru’s spiritual radiance, innocence, and the grace that shielded all around him. Pilgrims visit this sacred site to reflect on the profound message that truth, purity, and divine will safeguard those who walk the path of righteousness.

Day 7 - Gurdwara Shri Panja Saheb



Gurdwara Panja Sahib, located in Hasan Abdal, Pakistan, is one of the most sacred places in Sikh history. It is associated with a profound miracle performed by Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, demonstrating his divine grace, humility, and power to uplift humanity.

During his travels, Guru Nanak and Bhai Mardana arrived in Hasan Abdal, where a spiritually arrogant saint named **Wali Qandhari** lived on a hill. Wali controlled the only water source in the area, forcing the local people to depend entirely on him. When Guru Nanak's devotees requested water from Wali, he refused, showing anger and pride.

Seeing the thirst of the people, Guru Nanak lifted a small stone nearby, and to everyone's amazement, **a fresh, flowing spring of sweet water emerged**. When Wali Qandhari saw this, he became furious. In rage, he pushed a massive boulder down the hill to harm the Guru.

As the enormous rock rolled toward him, Guru Nanak Dev Ji simply raised his hand. The boulder halted instantly, leaving **the imprint of the Guru's hand—the Panja**—deeply marked in the stone. Witnessing this miracle, Wali's pride disappeared, and he fell at the Guru's feet, realizing the true divine power of humility and compassion.

Today, the sacred handprint still rests inside Gurdwara Panja Sahib, a symbol of Guru Nanak's unshakeable compassion and the victory of humility over ego. Pilgrims from across the world visit this holy shrine to experience its peace and spiritual strength.

Day 8 – Gurdwara Shri Kartarpur Saheb



Gurdwara Shri Kartarpur Sahib, located in the Narowal District of Pakistan, is one of the holiest and most historically significant sites in Sikhism. It stands at the sacred place where Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji founded the first Sikh community and spent the final 18 years of his life, preaching equality, compassion, and devotion to the Divine. The site is revered as the place of his earthly departure, making it a deeply emotional and spiritual destination for devotees. Originally established in 1522, the gurdwara has been beautifully reconstructed, featuring stunning Sikh and Islamic architectural influences and is often regarded as one of the largest gurdwaras in the world. Today, Kartarpur Sahib continues to embody the timeless message of Guru Nanak Dev Ji—of peace, humility, and universal brotherhood—drawing pilgrims from around the world to experience its serene and sacred atmosphere.

Day 9 - Gurdwara Shri Sacha Sauda



Gurdwara Shri Sacha Sauda marks the sacred site where Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji performed one of the earliest and most meaningful acts of his spiritual mission. As a young man, Guru Nanak Dev Ji was given twenty rupees by his father, Mehta Kalu Ji, to conduct a profitable business transaction. Instead of purchasing goods for resale, Guru Nanak Dev Ji used the money to buy food and clothes for starving saints he encountered on the way. When questioned later, Guru Nanak Dev Ji explained that helping the needy was the truest and most valuable bargain — the “Sacha Sauda”. This simple yet profound act revealed the essence of his teachings: compassion over material gain, service over self-interest, and the belief that true wealth lies in helping others. The gurdwara now stands at the very place where this divine deed took place, symbolizing Guru Nanak Dev Ji’s lifelong message of seva, charity, and righteousness. Pilgrims visit Gurdwara Shri Sacha Sauda to reflect on the purity of the Guru Nanak Dev Ji’s actions and the lesson that the most meaningful profit in life comes from doing good.

Day 9 - Gurdwara Shri Dera Sahib

Lahore, Pakistan



Gurdwara Shri Dera Sahib, located beside the historic Lahore Fort is one of the most important Sikh shrines in Pakistan. It marks the sacred site of the **martyrdom of Sri Guru Arjan Dev Ji**, the fifth Guru of the Sikhs. In 1606, Guru Arjan Dev Ji was subjected to severe torture on the orders of the Mughal authorities for refusing to alter the teachings of Sikhism. He endured unbearable heat, thirst, and suffering with complete serenity and acceptance of God's will.

It was along the banks of the Ravi River at this very location that Guru Arjan Dev Ji took his final bath and merged with the Divine—an event that forever shaped Sikh history. The gurdwara stands today as a powerful symbol of **sacrifice, resilience, and steadfast faith**. 




